

CHRISTIAN FISCAL COURT

ORDINANCE NO.: 2012- 01

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING HOURS FOR SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; PROHIBITED ACTS OF SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED that the Fiscal Court of Christian County, Kentucky, as follows:

Section One: No person or entity shall do any act authorized by any kind of license with respect to the manufacture, storage, sale, purchase, transport, or other traffic in alcoholic beverages unless that person or entity holds the kind of license which authorizes that act.

Section Two: Any holder of a permit from the Commonwealth of Kentucky to traffic in alcoholic beverages shall also be required to obtain a county license to sell or traffic in alcoholic beverages.

Section Three: Any person or entity conducting a place of business patronized by the public who does not have a license to sell alcoholic beverages shall not permit the sale or trafficking of alcoholic beverages on the premises of the business.

Section Four: All premises located in the unincorporated areas of Christian County, Kentucky for which a license has been granted to sell alcoholic beverages, including malt beverages, may remain open for business on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, from 6:00 a.m., (prevailing time) to 1:00 a.m. (prevailing time) the following day and from 6:00 a.m., Saturday (prevailing time) to 12:00 a.m., midnight (prevailing time).


Section Five: No alcoholic beverages, including malt beverages of any kind, may be sold on Sunday from 12:01 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. the following Monday (prevailing time); on Christmas Day, Thanksgiving Day, or during the hours that voting polls are open on any regular, primary or special election day.

Section Six - PENALTY: Any person found in violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and fined not more than \$500.00, imprisoned for not more than 30 days, or both.

ADOPTED on the second reading on the 24 day of JANUARY, 2012.

On motion of Esquire J. C. King, seconded by Esquire Douglas Walker it is ordered that a resolution be drawn to close the liquor places at 1:00 a.m. during the week and during the summer months. Resolution as follows:

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS the State of Kentucky is now operating on Daylight Saving Time, and whereas the City of Hopkinsville, Kentucky, in 1967, when the City was operating on Daylight Saving Time, amended its ordinance # 4-6.1 so that premises selling distilled spirits and wine at retail could remain open until one o'clock A.M. on weekdays during the months Daylight Saving Time is in effect, unless otherwise prohibited by law; and WHEREAS there are sundry places in Christian County, Kentucky, outside of the City Limits of Hopkinsville, Kentucky, which similarly serve alcoholic beverages, and whereas, it appears reasonable and equitable for said places to observe generally the same closing hours as those followed by similar places in the City of Hopkinsville;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, during the months Daylight Saving Time is observed that the closing hour for places selling spirituous, vinous or maltose beverages at retail in Christian County, Kentucky, outside of the City Limits of Hopkinsville, Kentucky, be set at one o'clock A.M. when said hour falls on a weekday.
